*Call to Worship

One: King Jesus comes, King Jesus, Son of God, Son of Man, Messiah.

ALL: Hail! King Jesus, King of all!

One: Recall the words of the Scriptures: "A great crowd who had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying, 'Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!"

ALL: In praise we adore you, King Jesus. Enter our hearts today as you entered Jerusalem long ago, and lead us by faith in the way everlasting. Amen.

Call to Worship - Our liturgy begins by acknowledging God as God. We begin with a "Call to Worship," a responsive reading often from a psalm. With this we focus our minds and hearts on our shared work of worship.

Prayer of Confession Each Sunday we have a corporate confession of sins and hear an assurance of pardon. We strive to use the form of confession sincerely, acknowledging our brokenness—in thought, word and deed —and to receive God's forgiveness through Jesus Christ in thankfulness.

Assurance of Pardon -We hear a reminder from Scripture that Jesus Christ has addressed the reality of sin through His life, death, resurrection and ascension.

Passing of the Peace-This is an ancient greeting of brothers and sisters in Christ. After we have reflected and entered into God's presence, we greet one another with the peace of Christ as common forgiven sinners. As we are forgiven, so we forgive. As you are able, greet those around you with a kind word.


